ISSUES, OBSERVATIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS

INTENTION OF THE LEGISLATURE -V-RIGHTS OF THE INDIVIDUALS

To provide for confiscation of the proceeds of crime, To deprive persons of the proceeds, benefits & properties derived from the commission of serious offences and To assist Law Enforcement Authorities in tracing the proceeds, benefits & properties and For related matters

PENAL PROVISIONS

- The Legislature had viewed the offences to be serious thus, both natural persons and body corporate have been made liable for punishment
- Provision for severe sentencing
- Fiji's legal framework is strong by international standards.
- Amendment brought in 2005 to sec 69 has widened the offence and made it stronger

SOME OF THE CHALLENGERS FOR THE PROSECUTORS

- Prosecutors function as the shock-absorbers
- Sophisticated crimes –v- traditional investigations
- Powerful statutory provisions –v- minimum workforce
- Advanced criminals –v- lack of awareness
- Cautioned interview –v- Independent Evidence

FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO DELAY

- Non availability of witnesses
- Non availability of exhibits
- Non-execution of summons on witnesses

 Any delay to which the accused has not contributed is favorably considered by the trial court at the time of sentencing

CONDUCT OF ACCUSED

- Non appearance Long periods of postponements, withdrawal of charges/information
- Abscond when the trial commences Turtle Island
- Absence of interest in the case failure to obtain legal representations due to lack of interest

UNITED WE STAND-DIVIDED WE FALL

- Team work between inter-agencies
- Absence of co-operation between different stake holders
- Lack of consistency

MUTUAL ASSISTANCE

- Investigations to be carried out abroad
- Witnesses to be got down from abroad
- restraining property or proceeds without delay
